Unrestricted Funds

An ideal way to address our community's highest priorities. The Foundation urges all donors to designate at least a portion of their fund for unrestricted purposes to help with special projects and changing community needs.

For donors who want to support specific charitable agencies or an area of special interest, such as education, the arts, or a particular geographic area. Designated & Field of Interest Funds

Agency Funds

Initiated by agencies and their donors to provide an annual income stream to non-profit organizations who wish to avoid the hassle of setting up/managing a private endowment themselves.

For donors who want to play a significant role in decisions about the use of fund proceeds. Advised fund donors make grant recommendations to the Foundation Board of Directors. Funds can be endowed or non-endowed.

Donor Advised Funds

Scholarship Funds

An ideal way to provide scholarships for youth. The Foundation manages the investments of the fund and administers scholarship services. A donor may define criteria for the scholarship.

Charitable remainder trust, lead trust, or gift annuity that delivers income for donor or a designee for fixed term or for life. Provides tremendous tax and estate planning advantages. Split Interest Funds

Deferred Gift Funds

An endowment funded later in life, usually at the end of life from estate or life insurance proceeds. Very simple and effective estate planning tool.

Established to hold, manage, and distribute funds for a specific project.

Special Project Funds

#### **HOW TO CREATE A FUND**

The process is simple and flexible, and your gift affords the maximum tax deduction. Based on your individual situation, our staff will advise you on the best way to leave a lasting legacy in our community.

Choose a name for your fund. Please choose with care as the name will remain with the fund forever.

Choose the fund type unrestricted, designated, field of interest, agency, donor advised, scholarship, or special project. 3

**Options:** cash, real estate, securities, wills, trusts, retirement accounts, and more.

## **GIFTS OF APPRECIATED ASSETS MAKE SENSE**

Sometimes a gift of an appreciated asset is the best way for you to make a charitable contribution. Such gifts can include real estate, oil & gas interests, interest in a family limited partnership, closely-held, non-publicly traded stocks, as well as publicly-traded stocks.

These gifts can be added to an existing fund of the Foundation or can be used to create a new endowed fund. They can also be used to fund a charitable gift annuity that will provide a donor with a lifetime of income with hefty tax savings.

An example: A donor owns a publicly traded stock and decides to donate 1,000 shares to a fund at the Foundation. The shares are worth \$100 each but were purchased ten years ago for \$20 each.

If the donor sold the stock and then made a charitable gift with cash, the donor would pay capital gains taxes on the profit. By gifting the stock, capital gains taxes are avoided, and the donor can deduct the full value of the gift.

Assuming a 33% tax bracket and 15% for long-term capital gains, the donor is able to

avoid more than \$15,000 in capital gains taxes while enjoying a hefty charitable tax deduction of more than \$33,000.

This same type of benefit can be available for other types of appreciated assets and removes the asset from a donor's estate, thus potentially lowering estate taxes.

## Bequests

Establish a fund through your will or trust.

#### Retirement accounts

Name the Foundation as beneficiary of your IRA, 401(k), or other retirement plan. At your passing, the retirement funds transfer to the Foundation without estate tax or income tax implications.

#### Charitable remainder trusts

The donor and/or other named beneficiaries retain a life income and earn immediate and long-term tax benefits. Upon termination, assets go to a charitable fund named and designed by the donor.

## Charitable gift annuities

A gift annuity is created by transferring cash or appreciated properties, such as stock, as an irrevocable gift to the Foundation. We distribute a guaranteed, fixed payment to you for the rest of your life. At your passing, the amount remaining in your gift annuity can be distributed between a discretionary fund and other charitable endowments established at the Foundation.

#### Charitable lead trusts

With a lead trust, donors establish an irrevocable fund that distributes cash to their favorite charities for a set number of years. When the trust expires, the assets within the trust revert to the donors or their selected beneficiaries. Donors have the opportunity to observe and enjoy their gifts being used for present needs.

#### Insurance

Name the Foundation as owner and beneficiary of an insurance policy to be used to establish a future charitable fund. The donor can earn an immediate tax deduction, and any additional premium payments also are potentially deductible.

## THE POWER OF DONORS: PIERCE AND BETTY MILLER

The San Angelo Area Foundation is blessed with hundreds of donors. In this annual report, the Foundation recognizes a donor who has made significant contributions to the Foundation and to philanthropy in the San Angelo area.



Pierce and Betty Miller were both raised in Crockett County and married in 1963. Pierce worked in banking for 18 years, then he and Betty began ranching in Crockett County full time. Betty was an inaugural board member of the Foundation from 2001 to 2012. They have been blessed with two children, Rhett and Camille, and three grandchildren. Rhett died in 1991 in a tragic auto accident, and two different scholarships were created in his memory by family and friends. This lasting legacy is just a start of their generosity and efforts to create legacies for those that follow.

Through their thoughtful planning and work with the San Angelo Area Foundation, these funds have already awarded over 20 scholarships totaling more than \$30,000 to recipients from Central High School, Rhett's Alma Mata. These scholarships will continue in perpetuity as a lasting legacy of Rhett.

The Millers have continued to foster use of the Foundation through their leadership by assisting in the creation of additional funds at the Foundation, including the Bill Sims Wool & Mohair Research

Endowment Fund, the Robert and Mary Payne Massie Memorial Scholarship, and have provided additional financial support to several other funds of the Foundation. Pierce and Betty Miller are excellent examples of donors the Foundation is blessed to know.

The West Texas Boys Ranch is a home to young men, a trusted friend to families that need help raising their sons and a valuable resource to the community. At the Ranch, the mission of Raising Boys & Building Men are teaching young boys that being successful in life begins at home.

Grant funding from the San Angelo Area Foundation provides a safe and caring environment for boys to live, while creating teaching opportunities along the way. New washers and dryers have benefited the boys in learning to be responsible while new living room furniture has created a comfortable and warm family environment for them to fellowship with one another.

#### **2013 SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS**

Students have received more than 2,500 scholarships worth more than \$5 million since the inception of the San Angelo Area Foundation. In 2013, over 450 students received scholarships.

Scholarships are available due to the generosity of donors who have created more than 90 different scholarship funds. Creating scholarship funds for area youth has been a priority of the foundation from the beginning.

#### How to set up a scholarship fund

Our staff at the Foundation will work with you to answer questions like:

- What do I want to name the fund?
- Do I want the fund to last for several years (endowed)?
- Do I want to target a particular field of study?
- Do I care what college the student desires to attend?
- Do I care what high school the student graduates from?

With those questions answered, the Foundation prepares an agreement and a fund is created. Donations to scholarship funds are tax deductible. (Please consult your professional tax advisor about your individual situation.)

"How much does it take to set up a scholarship fund?" This is a question we often get, and the truthful answer is, "It depends..." Our endowment investment philosophy allows us to grant 5% of a rolling three-year average. For example, a \$50,000 endowed scholarship fund would produce \$2,500 each year in scholarships, in perpetuity, and allow the awards to increase in size over time.

So the answer begins with the end in mind: "How much do you want to award each year in scholarships?" This allows us to calculate the amount needed to create a permanent endowment. To learn more, give us a call.



#### **GUIDELINES FOR GRANT SEEKERS**

As a community foundation, the SAAF seeks to support the entire range of human needs in the San Angelo area. With limited resources, however, we also must make judgments based on relative need and potential impact. Preference is given to applications that:

- Address a need in the San Angelo area.
- Enable charitable agencies to perform essential services that reduce costs, increase efficiency, build self-sufficiency, and strengthen internal management capabilities.
- Demonstrate strong volunteer involvement, broad community support, and increase the ability of existing institutions to reach a broader segment of the community.
- Are developed in consultation with other agencies to eliminate duplication of services.

Note that a grand seeker must be a 501(c)(3) tax-exempt organization, a school, or governmental sub-division.

- Grant requests must be completed online by September 1.
- If needed, we will contact you for additional information in September.
- Grants are awarded by December.


All grant decisions are made by our volunteer grants committee, supported by professional staff.


#### **OUR LONG TERM INVESTMENT PHILOSOPHY**

The San Angelo Area Foundation exists to provide perpetual income for endowments that benefit charities and philanthropic desires in the Concho Valley. Active investment management of funds is the best practice to accomplish this mission.

Our investment strategy permits us to distribute 5% annually in grants. This allows funds to increase in value during positive times and protects the value of the investment against inflation and market challenges.

The Foundations' board of directors and its investment committee works closely with our investment consultants to ensure we are positioned to achieve the goals of making distributions, while growing the principal, ensuring the perpetual nature of our funds.




