Park Goals:

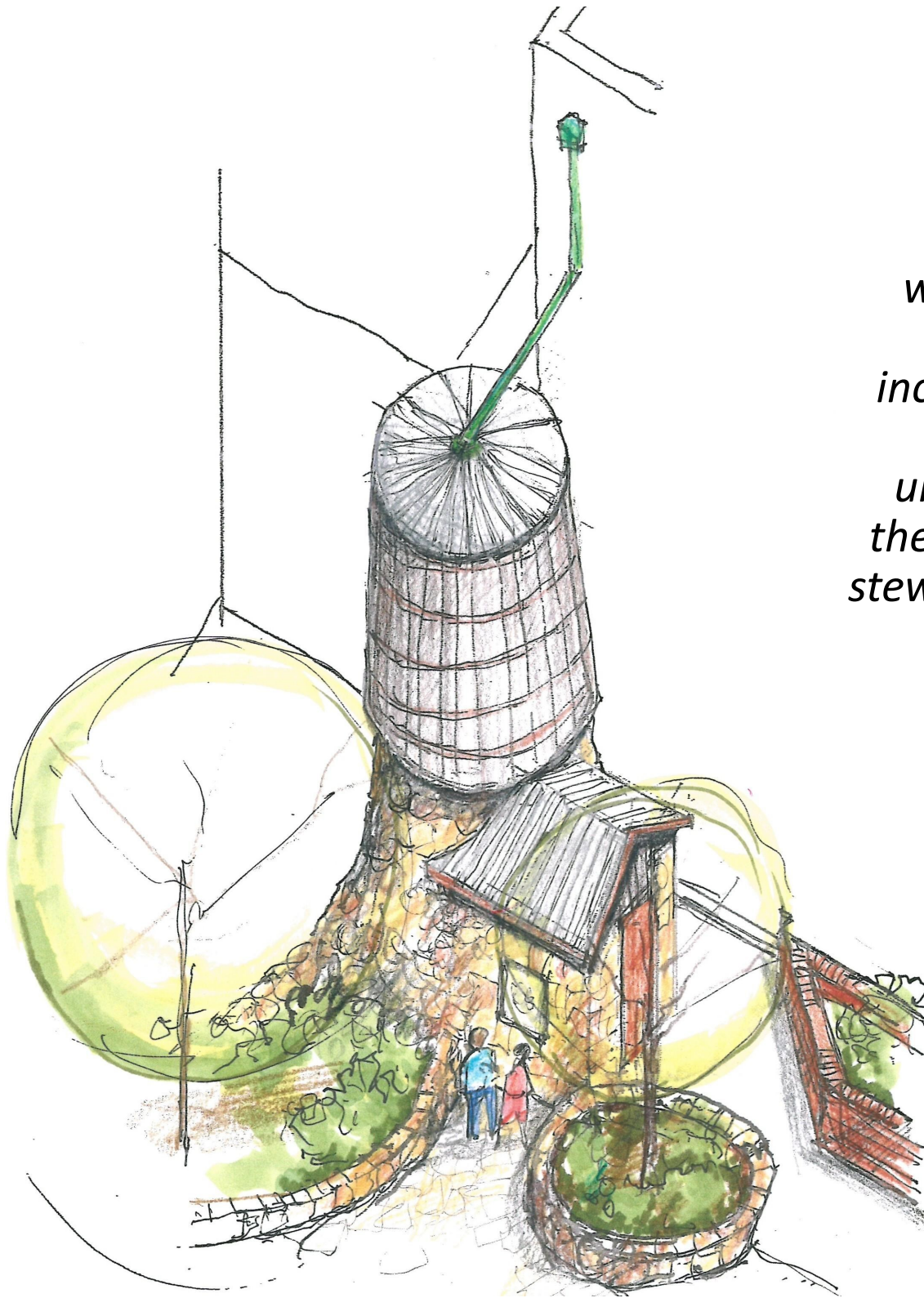
- Educate younger generations about the rich ranching heritage of West Texas

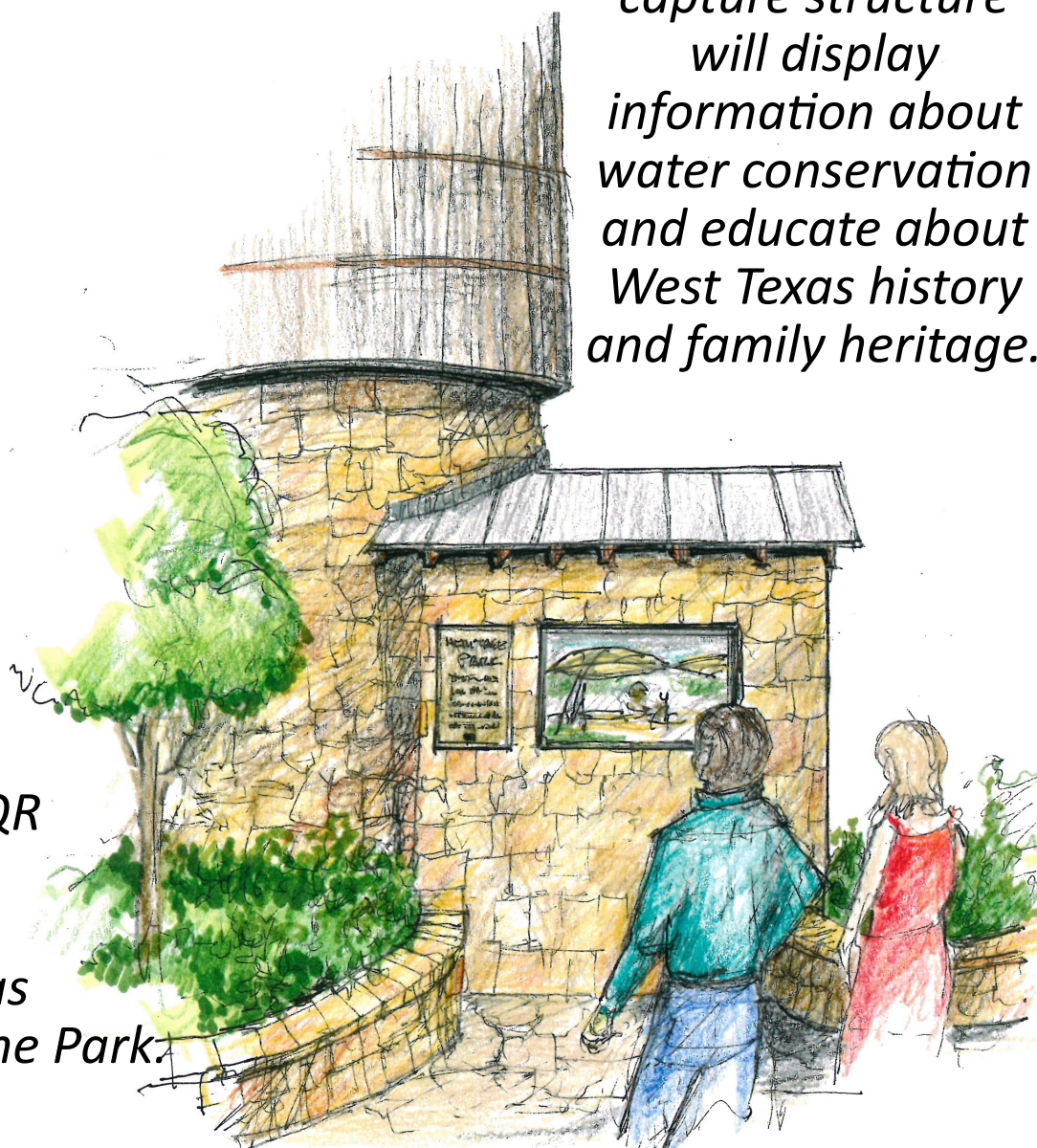


*A rain-water catchment system coupled with a well-designed educational program has been incorporated into the design, encouraging visitors to understand and appreciate the importance of being good stewards of that God-given gift: **RAIN.***



Visitors will be able to access a QR (quick response) code linked to a webpage, providing even more information about the West Texas Heritage exhibited throughout the Park.

An educational looping video housed in the rain-water capture structure will display information about water conservation and educate about West Texas history and family heritage.





A picturesque water feature acknowledges this precious resource that has sustained our way of life for generations, rejuvenating our faith and our hope for the future.



Native limestone, the very foundation on which our heritage is built, is incorporated into the park design, as are boulders from the ranches of West Texas pioneers whose true grit and personal integrity were rock-solid.



The life-size sculpture of a rancher standing behind his saddled horse, Stetson hat in hand, reminds visitors of the connection between man and nature, the indisputable impact the livestock/agriculture industry has played in the development of West Texas, and the rugged individualism that defines West Texas.
