

## **OCTOBER 3, 2023**

Members of Future Fund met on October 3, 2023 for a fun evening filled with good food, good music, and great friends. After great discussion, review of the survey and Q&A from the group, the consensus was to award the following organizations a grant from Future Fund.

**GALILEE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT, CORP.**\$30,000

ALL-TEX SPLASH PAD FUND \$10,000 Future Fund has touched many lives in San Angelo and your generosity has helped local organizations in our community tackle difficult challenges. Grant requests made to the Foundation and survey results were discussed along with Q&A from the group. An additional project, All- Tex Splash Pad Fund was proposed for consideration by Future Fund member, Susan Brooks. After discussion of all projects presented, members voted to award the following organizations a grant from Future Fund.

## **GALILEE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT- \$30,000**

Galilee Community Development Corporation can help provide and restore affordable housing for low to moderate income residents in our community. Some of our most at-risk population for homelessness is the 18-30 year demographic, many who are coming out of high school, aging out of the foster care system, working only part time while going to college and struggling to meet the high cost of rent. To address the need for affordable housing, Galilee CDC purchased an empty 8-unit apartment building on 9th street, has funding to start the remodel and is seeking funds to complete the project. The Public Housing Authority will manage the building once complete and Galilee will provide financial training to help tenants eventually move to "next step" housing when they can better afford rent. This project will also help a blighted area and impact generations. *Grant funding from Future Fund, combined with other funds of the Foundation total \$90,750 fully funding their request.* 

## ALL-TEX SPLASH PAD FUND - \$10,000

Nestled in the heart of community neighborhoods, splash pads provide barrier-free access to activities for not only community members, but also visitors. Offering a safe and shallow play area, splash pad technology includes ground nozzles that spray water upward and each pad will have unique features that will make the experience enjoyable for children and families of all ages. The unique water recirculating system of the splash pads will ensure minimal water loss due to wind, sun, and high usage. Some of the amenities currently accessible at each park include restrooms, parking, playground, walking trails, picnic areas, and lighted pavilion. The addition of these splash pads is a journey to create a new experience and will amplify two of San Angelo's community. Grant funding from Future Fund was matched and helped achieve the \$100,000 challenge gift from ASCO Foundation.
