October 25, 2018 Future Fund awards \$30,000 in grants!

Members of Future Fund met on October 25th at Raw 1899 for a fun night of grant making and ghost walk! After discussion of grant requests and survey results, the consensus was to award the following organizations a grant from Future Fund! Your generosity will help these organizations tackle difficult challenges in the Concho Valley!



\$10,000 Sonora Flood Relief Fund – Heavy rains cumulated through September 21, 2018 resulted in catastrophic flooding in Sonora, damaging more than 200 homes in the path of the destructive floodwaters. As one of the many critical philanthropic efforts needed to support flood victims, the Sonora Ministerial Alliance and local leadership collaborated with the San Angelo Area Foundation utilizing our ability to quickly manage and award emergency grants by creating the Sonora Flood Relief Fund. Friends and neighbors from across the nation have shown their support for Sonora by contributing to the fund and the outpouring of generosity has helped raise more than \$370,000 and has provided \$100,000 in emergency grants thus far to families coping with loss. The Foundation will be working closely with the Sutton County Long Term Recovery Group led by community leaders to help transition from recovery to rebuilding.

Grant funding from Future Fund will help with long term rebuilding efforts in Sonora.



\$5,000 Junior League of San Angelo - At every SAISD campus, disadvantaged children attend school in dirty, ill-fitting or threadbare clothing and shoes. The lack of proper clothing many times prevents children and teens from performing at their upmost potential and can lead to be a barrier for regular attendance. The JLSA works with school counselors, at risk coordinators, teachers, and community advocates identifying students in need and providing these students with quality clothing. ***Grant funding from Future Fund combined with other funds of the Foundation total \$13,500 toward project!***



\$5,000 West Texas Counseling & Guidance – Tom Green County has a suicide rate 34% higher than the state average. Statistics show that loved ones left behind are then 65% more likely to attempt suicide themselves. The need for trained staff and volunteers is urgent when considering the alarming number of suicide deaths in our area. The LOSS team provides immediate emotional support to those who have recently suffered the loss of a loved one to suicide. The Loss team responds as a means to instill hope for survivors and pairs a licensed mental health professional and a trained survivor of suicide to provide vital postvention support. ***Grant funding from Future Fund combined with other funds of the Foundation total \$16,000 to organization!***

\$5,000 West Texas Boys Ranch– Located 12 miles west of San Angelo, WTBR relies solely on two water wells (drilled in 1975) to provide water for 32 boys, 20 employees, and 6 employee family members. A sustainable water source is critical for the ranch to provide basic needs to those served and currently only one well produces enough water. Drilling of an additional well will secure water for the youth served and provide a reliable source water for decades to follow. ***Grant funding from Future Fund combined with other funds of the Foundation total \$30,000 to organization!***

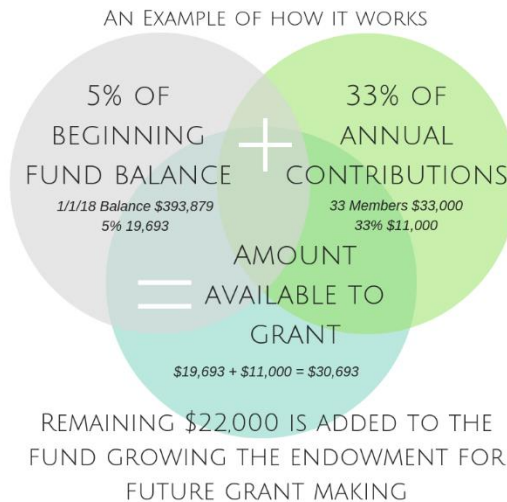

\$5,000 Special Olympics – Individuals with disabilities often lead sedentary lifestyles and are disproportionality more likely to experience health problems. To improve preventative health and wellness measures, the core service of Special Olympics Texas is to provide athletic training and competition in a variety of Olympic type sports for individuals with intellectual disabilities. The goal of Special Olympics is to provide opportunities for all that wish to participate and will therefore never turn an athlete away. Funding will allow children and adults from the Concho Valley to experience the benefits of participation including improved self-confidence, language, adaptive and socialization skills, stronger family relationships, better performance in school and increase in employment opportunities. ***Grant funding from Future Fund combined with other funds of the Foundation total \$10,000 fully funding the request!***
