JULY 4 FLOOD DISASTER RELIEF



More than **1,900** homes affected, damaged or destroyed by floodwaters.



Your gift - combined with others has helped raise **\$5,605,089** as of February 1, 2026.



In the first 180 days **\$2,147,607** has been awarded in emergency grants to impacted neighbors and community partners to provide assistance with repair and rebuilding costs.



Many local businesses were also impacted by this flood. Grants included **\$250,000**, made available for businesses with physical property damage through the **LiftFund**, ensuring a strong economic infrastructure of resilience.



As part of the **Long Term Recovery Group**, the San Angelo Area Foundation remains committed, helping neighbors whose recovery continues. In collaboration with community partners, the disaster fund will ensure that no one faces this crisis in isolation with **\$3,457,482** dedicated to long-term recovery and unmet needs.

On July 4th more than 14 inches of rain accumulated in San Angelo and surrounding areas resulting in devastating flooding across the Concho Valley.
