Future Fund awards  
\$40,000 in grants

**OCTOBER 6, 2022**

Members of Future Fund met on October 6, 2022 for a fun evening filled with good food, good music, and great friends.

After great discussion, review of the survey and Q&A from the group, the consensus was to award the following organizations a grant from Future Fund.

## **THE WHIT PROGRAM - \$15,000**

According to TEA, Foster Children have the lowest high school graduation rate of any group tracked by the state. The WHIT program, leverages college honors students to provide one on one tutoring in Math and English to children in foster care each week. Success has been seen with improvements in grades and in grade level advancement. This grant will help build staff capacity, sustainability, and continue providing tutoring to foster students in our area. ***Grant funding from Future Fund, combined with other funds of the Foundation total \$24,000 to organization, fully funding this request.***

## **CAC OF GREATER WEST TEXAS- \$10,000**

Children's Advocacy Center provides trauma focused therapy services at no cost to the client. CAC currently has a team of 5 full time therapists and a clinical services director. Each team member is a licensed LPC or PLC-A certified in trauma focused cognitive behavior therapy. In 2022, 320 children and non-offending caregivers were served through 4,410 sessions. This is a 39% increase from 2021. Continued support ensures therapy services are provided at no cost to those in need. ***Grant funding from Future Fund, combined with other funds of the Foundation total \$30,000 to organization.***

## **TEXAS RAMP PROJECT- \$7,500**

Keeping homes accessible especially to older adults is priority for Texas Ramps. Ramps are built by volunteers, for individuals who have been identified based on need by local health care providers. In 2021, 61 ramps were built and so far in 2022, 40 additional ramps have been built. This grant will provide lumber and materials for up to 25 ramps for San Angelo's most vulnerable citizens. ***Grant funding from Future Fund, combined with other funds of the Foundation total \$20,000 to organization.***

## **JOSEPH THOMAS FOUNDATION- \$7,500**

Assists medically fragile children and families across Texas. Financial assistance is provided for equipment and supplies not covered by insurance. The new closet program maintains equipment and supplies needed daily such as ventilators, nebulizers, and inhalers. With supply delays it is increasingly important for families to have immediate access to these supplies. JTF estimates serving over 400 families in our 17 county area in the coming year.
